Linger in Beauty: Disinterestedness and *Aesthetic* Feeling of Life

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Abstract: This paper explores the relationship between the disinterested nature of aesthetic pleasure and what I refer to as an 'aesthetic feeling of life'. My aim is to claim disinterestedness is the condition of such an aesthetic feeling of life since it is precisely disinterestedness that allow us to linger in beauty thus, to be aware of our feeling of life. Interestingly, the notion of 'lingering' in its German forms weilen, Verweilung resonates the German term for 'boredom' langen Weile (literally means 'long-while') which is the opposite of the feeling of life in its common/empirical sense. Based on an affinity between the 'lingering' state of mind in beauty and boredom the question arises whether there is a sense in which boredom is compatible with the feeling of life in its aesthetic sense.
